

Farm Fresh Strawberries is home to the Chandler and Albion strawberries. Farmers, Luu Saevang and his wife Nai Saetern, came to Yuba City in 2019 to grow the sweetest berries in town. Luu says he was intrigued and inspired by his brother who is also a farmer. Over the past 4 years, their 6 acre farm has grown with the help of their son, daughter, and Luu's brother-in-law. Science: Cultivated ("garden") strawberries are a hybrid species of the wild strawberry, Fragaria (Fragaria × ananassa). They belong to the rose family, Rosaceae. The "seeds" on the outside of the strawberry are actually achenes- small dry fruits containing the seeds. Strawberries are not grown from seeds, but rather from runners. Each year the parent plant sends out runners and starts new small plants. If these are in contact with soil they will grow roots and establish a new plant.



Fun Facts for all ages!

- Strawberries are the only fruit that wear their seeds on the outside. The average berry is adorned with 200 of them.
- Scientists don't classify strawberries as a true berry! True berries, like blueberries and cranberries, have seeds inside.
- California produces one billion pounds of strawberries each year- the weight of 67,000 male elephants!
- You can eat the green top of a strawberry (calyx).
- Strawberries at room temperature are sweeter than cold ones.



Strawberry Granita

- 4 cups strawberries
- 2-3 Tbsp lemon juice
- 3 Tbsp maple syrup, honey, or agave nectar
- 1. Wash & de-stem and chop into halves.
- 2. Blend in blender or food processor until smooth.
- 3. Pour into freezer safe pan. and spread evenly.
- 4. Place in freezer.
- 5. Freeze for a few hours or overnight.
- Shave with a fork before serving.



History: Wild strawberry species have been collected and cultivated in many parts of the world for thousands of years. Strawberries are mentioned in Roman literature and were used for medicinal purposes. Indigenous peoples of North and South America collected and cultivated wild strawberries long before the arrival of Europeans. Charles V, France's king from 1364 to 1380, had 1,200 strawberry plants in his royal garden. The modern strawberry was first bred in Brittany, France, in the 1750s via a cross of wild strawberry varieties from North and South America.


